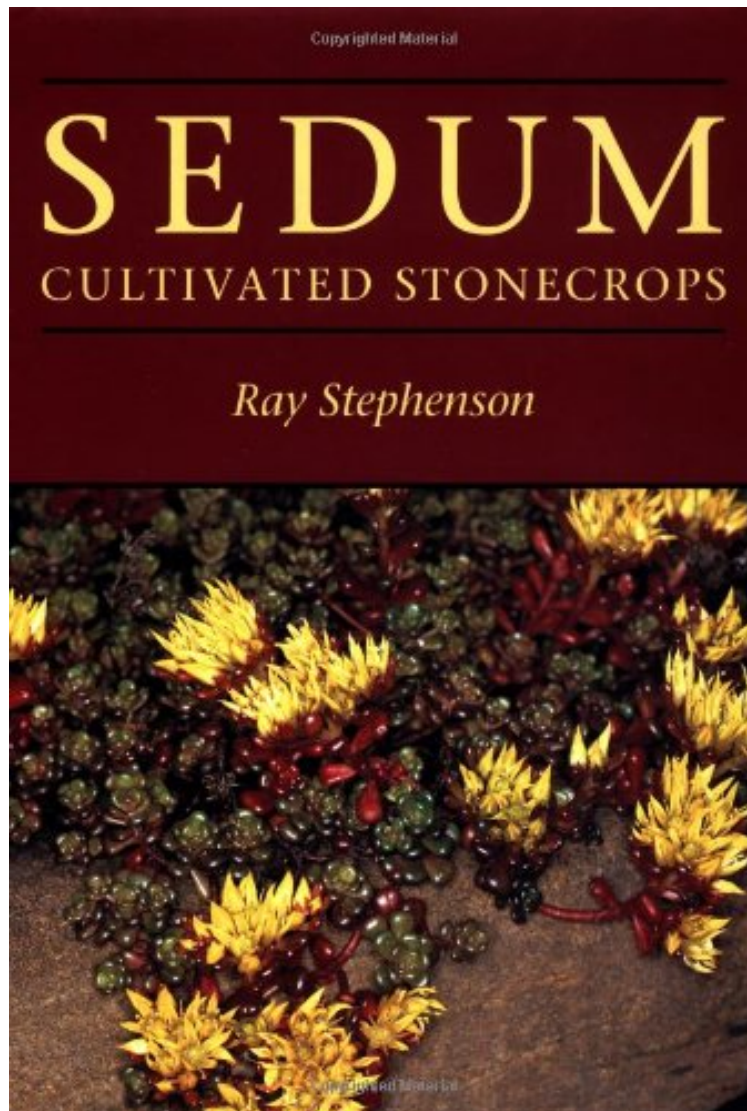

Recently it came up missing and I needed to replace it. Which I did with a 'Like New Ex-Library' edition. When I received the book I was delighted. It arrived promptly. Accessorized with high quality neatly fitted clear plastic book cover and showing little

evidence of ever having been used, I was happy to have acquired this book at less than half the cost (\$23.10) of the original price paid (\$50.00). But the first time I actually used this book I realized that the library edition was missing nearly half the of the color plates that are so useful for identification. Sadly, I also noted that nearly all the black white photos were also omitted from the final 75 pages of this 'Library' edition.
