I bought it because I want to make the bag on the cover but the book is filled with really cute projects like a little zipper bag decorated with a machine applied fan pattern. The patterns included would require some experience with sewing. There is a section in the back of the book with some basic sewing skills used in the book such as satin stitch and edge stitching but it is not

enough for a beginner sewer. Adding a zipper closure to a bag is a little more difficult than is covered in the paragraph included.
