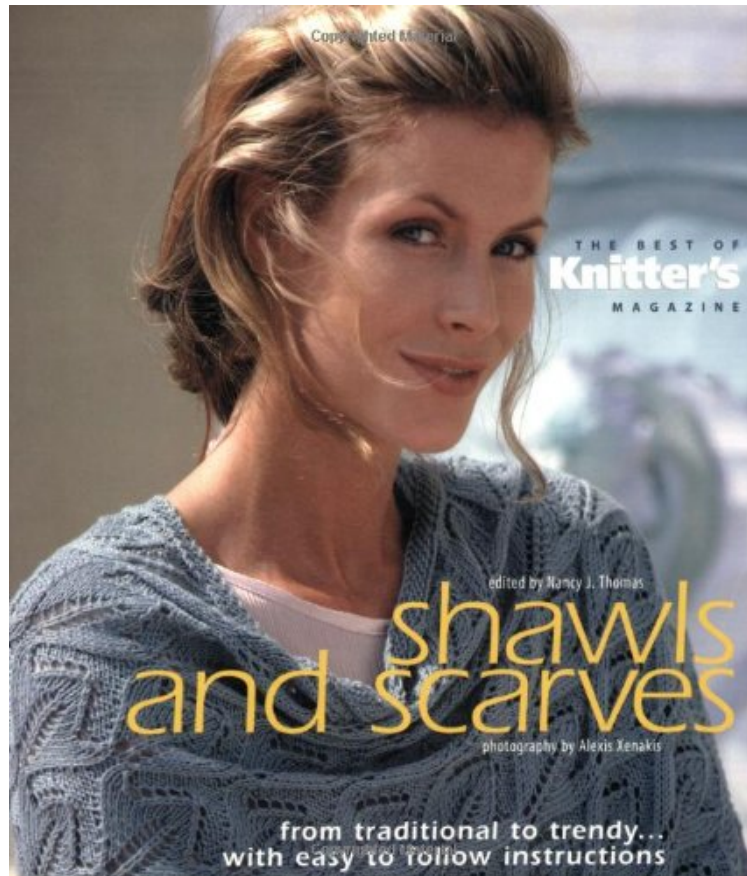

The beautiful patterns in this book speak for themselves, but the errors are REALLY sloppy and unforgivable. The patterns have already been published and the kinks should have been worked out. If you elect to change a pattern after the sample was knit, you should knit the revised version to check it out as well. I made the notorious yellow shawl and I could have knit it twice in the time it took to compensate for the errors as shown in the charting. What a shame that Lark and the distinguished authors would put up with this. The lovely patterns and shaping of the garments require plenty of skill, and multiple mistakes make them downright formidable - even for a lifelong knitter. Buy the book for the wealth of patterns, but be sure to compare every step to the errata pages which will continue to grow, I'm sure. For a public library, a compilation of this sort has many advantages. It is more sturdy than the original magazine, it brings together designs by theme, and it corrects errors that might have been present in the original patterns. Contributors include a "who's who" of knitwear designers, among them Elizabeth Zimmermann, Meg Swansen, Eugene Beugler, Joan Schrouder, and Priscilla Gibson-Roberts. Most patterns include both charted and written directions as well as full-color photos. Generic yarn recommendations make this collection one that will be used for many years.
