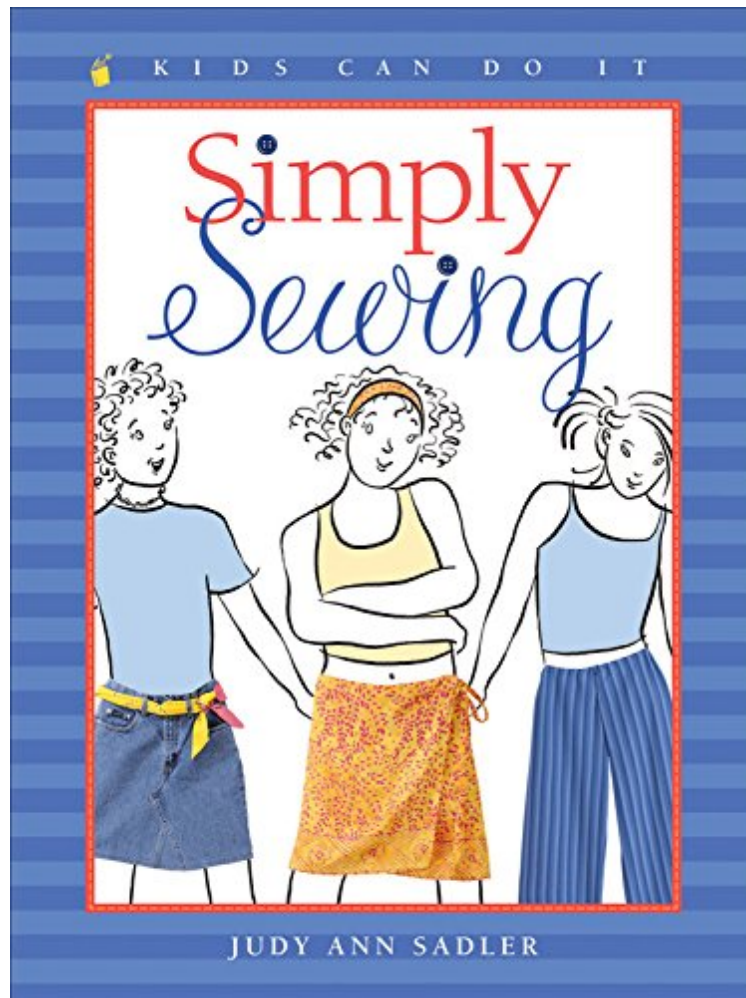

Simply Fabulous Sewing For Beginners By chicvibe I got this book as a learning/teaching book for my 5 year old daughter and myself. Every project is simple, but still interesting, like a drawstring t-shirt skirt, pj pants, and cosmetic bag, to name a few. There are no patterns for tops, but perhaps simple top patterns will be included in a later version. Well written (with both metric and inches noted), with plenty of illustrations in a clean format make this book a great self-learning book for a pre-teen as well as novice sewing moms. The book also shows hand-sewing stitches and explains that all projects can be hand-sewn, but will take a little longer. There is basic information regarding the sewing machine, which includes tension, types of stitches, and components.

This book in the Kids Can Do It series features breezy wraps and terrific tote bags for the beach, neat trims for plain clothes or a skirt made from worn-out jeans -- Simply Sewing has these and many other projects all stitched up! Includes sewing-machine basics, hand-sewing stitches and fabric facts. Step-by-step instructions with full-color illustrations and photos make it "sew" simple!

From School Library Journal Grade 4-8 This kid-friendly book opens with a section on sewing supplies and describes the items used to complete the activities. Subsequent chapters discuss fabric and the basics of hand and machine stitching. A labeled illustration of a sewing machine is included. Each of the 12 projects is accompanied by a color photo, step-by-step color illustrations, and a list of supplies needed, which are easily obtainable through recycling or from craft/sewing shops. Projects include a slumber sack, a beach wrap, a zippy pillow, and machine applique. Back matter consists of 16 applique patterns. Adult help may be needed for machine sewing and ironing. After suggesting supplies for a sewing kit, offering tips on working with fabric, and giving basic instructions for hand sewing and using a sewing machine, Sadler moves on to the projects. Each two- or four-page project section begins with a photo of the finished item and includes a list of supplies, step-by-step directions illustrated with colorful drawings, and ideas for project variations.
