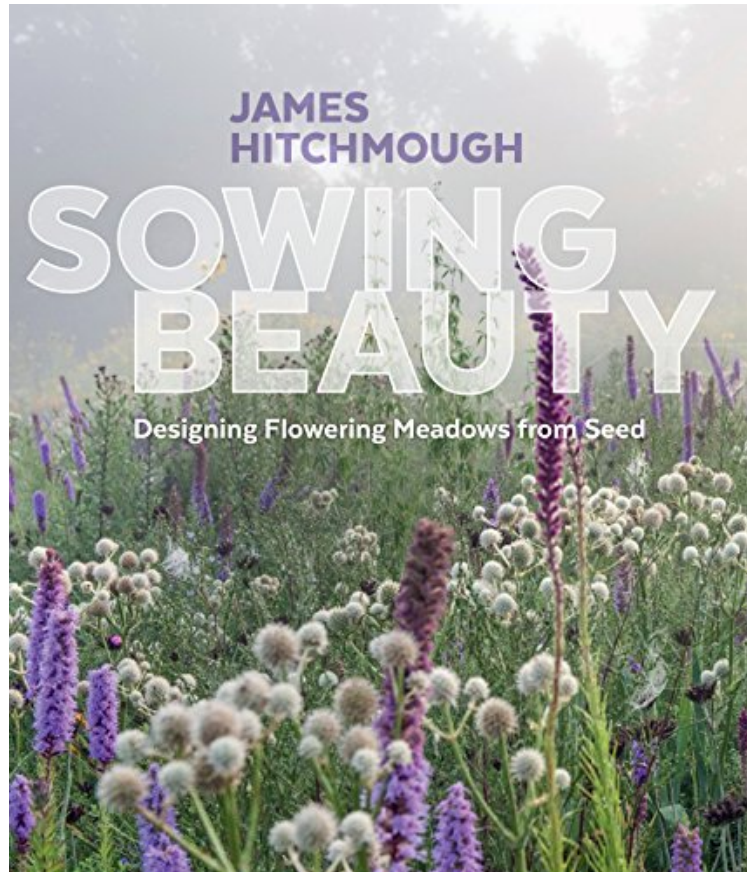

Most books limit themselves to meadows in the midwest and maybe the east, but this is far, far more inclusive. It is complex enough that I am still finding new information especially in charts after reading it several times.Hitchmough prefers meadows which include but are not limited to natives since he feels the public will appreciate a more attractive meadow than most natives can provide.
