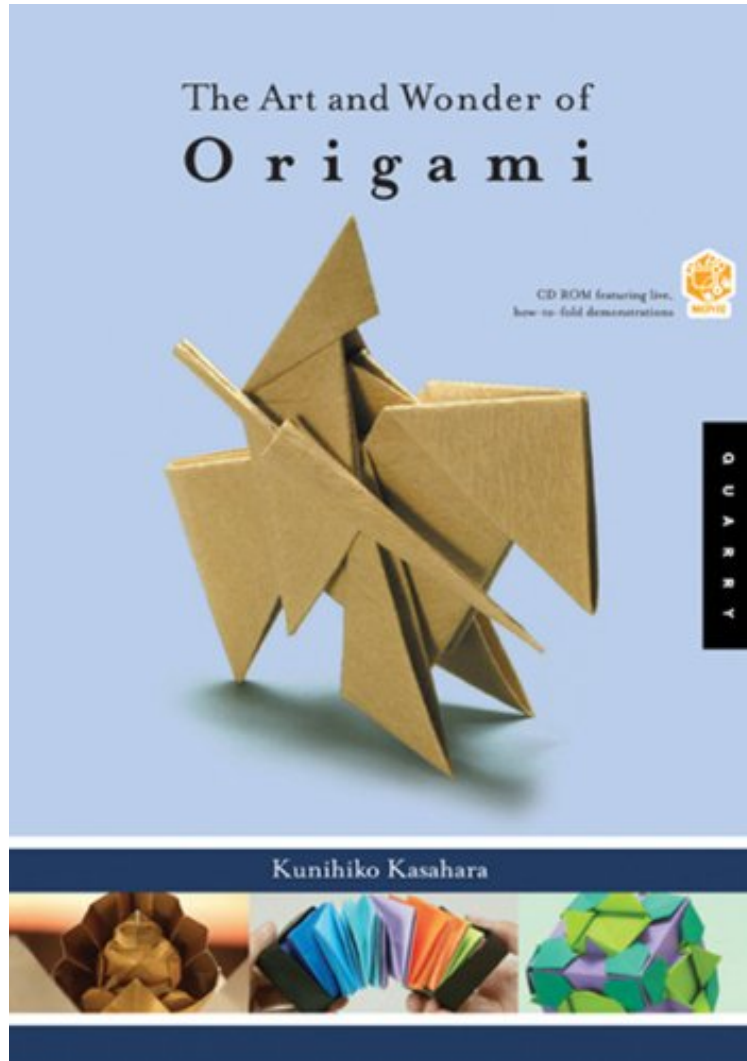

He lies in Kanagawa, Japan.
