Needs MAJOR updates...By Kerry FreemanI chose this rating for one simple reason: The frequencies are COMPLETELY out of date; and several new commuter rail "agencies" and light rail operations have surfaced. Mr, Sturm; if you are still alive, PLEASE, update this book! Two examples of new commuter projects in my local area (D/FW) are the Trinity Rail Express (TRE), and the light rail/city bus "agency" called Dallas Area Rapid Transit (or DART for short.)
